The Rt. Rev. Dr. Malayail Sabu Koshy Cherian has been consecrated as the New Bishop of the CSI Madhya Kerala Diocese.

The Rt. Rev. Dr. Sabu K Cherian, who was ordained as a deacon of the CSI in 1988 and a presbyter in 1989, is 59 years old and now is chosen to lead the Madhya Kerala Diocese as the Bishop in the coming eight years. He started his ministry as a missionary in the Andhra Mission (currently Telangana Mission) where his wife Dr. Mrs. Jessy Sara Koshy joined him in the mission work as a missionary doctor. The Right Reverend Doctor Sabu K Cherian is blessed with two sons; Mr. Sibu Cherian Koshy who is married to Ms. Roopa Esther Philip and settled in Ireland and Dr. Sam John Koshy who is currently pursuing his post-graduation in Chennai.

During the secular education, The Rt. Rev. Dr. Sabu K Cherian earned BSc in Mathematics, PGDCA, B.Ed, and MA in Sociology. Later he received his Bachelor of Divinity (BD) from UBS, Pune and Doctor of Ministry from New York Theological Seminary.

He is known for his ecumenical convictions. He was the Member, Kerala Council of Churches, founding President, Ecumenical Fellowship in Kumplampoika, Vice President, Bible Society Kerala Auxiliary, Vice President, Ecumenical Fellowship Kottayam, President, Union Christian Fellowship in Mavelikara, Vice President, Ecumenical Clergy Fellowship Thiruvalla, Member, Christian Medical College Governing Council Vellore, Member, Nilackal Ecumenical Trust, Nilackal and President, Ecumenical Fellowship in Mooledom.

Report after reading Gospel of Matthew

The Gospel of Matthew is a marvellous book written by Matthew the tax collector. Matthew was a disciple of Jesus Christ, and it seems his goal was to paint Jesus as the messiah when writing this gospel. Several quotations and references scattered throughout the book help connect Jesus with the old testament. Matthew compares Jesus to the prophecies foretold by the prophets. After reading the Gospel of Matthew, it is difficult to deny that Christ is the son of God. Throughout the book, Jesus gives many teachings. Some are taught in simple quotes, others in grand speeches, and some in complicated parables. Some lessons require research and context, while others are easy to understand off the bat.

One lesson that stood out to me was the warning of those who pretend to be godly. "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves." (Matthew 7:15). There are numerous occasions throughout the gospel where this theme occurs. It is especially prominent when Jesus talks about or interacts with the Pharisees. The Pharisees pretended to know God, but they were greedy and self-absorbed. They were hypocrites. The Pharisees preyed on those with weak roots and led them astray. In this book, we learn not to fall a victim to those in sheep's clothing, but instead to keep our faith rooted in the Bible.

Another common and compelling teaching I found valuable was to have faith. "For truly I tell you, if you have the faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you." (Matthew 17:20). We see what happens to those that doubt Jesus many times in the gospel. Even his disciples had doubts. When Jesus called Peter to walk on water, his weak faith and doubt caused him to sink. Jesus's disciples weren't able to heal others because of their little faith. However, we also see what happens when people believe in Jesus. The blind has seen, the muted have talked, those with leprosy were healed, and the paralyzed have walked. Even those who have never looked to God before were saved because they had faith in Jesus.

Another lesson taught in the Gospel of Matthew is to not run after earthly possessions. Instead, be content with what you have and give whenever you can. "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come and follow me." (Matthew 19:21). When doing this, you mustn't boast your good deeds to the public like the Pharisees. God rewards those who give in secret and without selfish intentions. He rewards those who are humble and put others first.

The Gospel of Matthew was an intriguing read. It included various themes and tones. Sometimes it was confusing and shocking, while other times it was simple and composed. I learned many lessons from this book and am looking forward to applying them to my daily life.
