Dearly Beloved in Christ,

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ!

We live in a beautiful ecological environment, but many a time, we fail to retain its beauty and value in our day-to-day life. As we enter into the month of June which focusses on the environment, let us remember that the earth belongs to God, and we as humans were created to be stewards of the world God created and we were put in charge of preserving it. Humans and all other creations are inter-related and interdependent, but as humans we have all the freedom, but also the responsibility to ensure the welfare of everything that surrounds us; both living and non-living things. We are asked to be caretakers of nature not exploiters of it. God gave humans a three-fold responsibility, "to till, to subdue and to keep" that which was founded in Genesis' account of creation. The prophetic book of Isaiah (Isaiah: 11:6-8) shows the vision of God that, all beings (creation) should coexist in perfect harmony and unity.

In this age of consumerism we have forgotten our responsibilities and we use earth's resources for our selfish motives. We as Christians, must fight against eco-injustice. Our mission should be based on the theme of reconciliation and the three fold relationships in proper manner, i.e. the relationship between God and humankind, the relationship between God and creation, and relationship between humankind and creation. Through this model, our understanding of Christian mission as building a new community of God should be our response to the present environmental crisis. To maintain creation, human participation of responsible love and justice is necessary. Human participation is also needed to keep the Earth fertile and productive (Genesis 2:5, 3:17-19). All distortions of creation, compounded by human violence, disobedience and greed, will have to be redeemed in Christ (Romans 8:13-28). The final vision of a new heaven and a new Earth (Revelations. 21:1-4) is accomplished by God and human beings together.

We have to re-think how can we worship the creator God when creation is being exploited? As a church and community of believers we can heed some practical things in our daily lives; to respect all things that God created whether weak or strong, to be a preserver, not to be a destroyer, to plant more trees and plants, to use natural resources carefully and preserve them. Let our worship bring us closer to nature and our concern with nature make us aware to treat the environment as our neighbor and to love it as we love ourselves.
